- **Wooden benches will not be provided at ringside this year and spectators will not be allowed to sit at ringside to ensure social distancing is maintained for those exhibiting in the ring.**

*Your dog is vulnerable and at risk if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered slightly warm. Please care of your dog. If your dog is planned to be a risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.*

#### REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (ANNEX B)

1. The Regulations must be observed when the dog is preparing for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under the show regulations and /or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club rule A 42.
  - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
  - b) Unless similar provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42
- 2 a) no substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
  - b) Any other substance (other than water), which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act Corp, which alters natural confirmation of a dog or any part thereof, may be performed except:
  - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the general committee.
  - (b) The removal of any due claws of any breed.
  - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.  
Norman anything be done, calculated in the opinion of the general committee to deceive.
4. The general committee without previous notice may order examination of any dog or dogs at any show. Any examination does order will be made by a person having executed authority who shall have a written directive from et al club in their possession. Samples may be taken further examination and analysis.
5. Any individual has the right lodge an objection to a dog. Only if he/ she is the owner or handler of a dog and are competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, been lodged by an official of the show or by anyone, so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection for the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds of the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objections by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the show secretary at his/her office before the close of the show an individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

## Rules & Regulations cont.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.

- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results.

Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club

Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered

19. No modification will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

20. Puppies 4-6 calendar months of age will be allowed in the show - entered not for competition, but must be under adult supervision at all times.

21. Should a Judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement, the Committee reserve to the right to appoint another to judge or judges in their place. Exhibitors may withdraw from competition, but no entry fees can be returned.

22. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and to exclude and remove any dog which in the opinion of the Veterinary Surgeon is not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, vice, or any other cause, but no entry fee will be returned

23. Any owner, exhibitor or handler or other person in charge of a dog is requested to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club Licensed Show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car/caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.

24. No animal other than an exhibit shall be brought into the precincts of a Dog Show during its continuance except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee.

25. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries for this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by Kennel Club Rules and Regulations, and it is on this understanding only, that entries are received.

26. The Catalogue will contain owner's names addresses in alphabetical order.

27. Should a judge be prevented from fulfilling his/ her duties? The committee reserve the right to appoint another judge. Exhibitors will be at liberty to withdraw the dogs from exhibition, but no entry fees can be refunded.

28. The committee of the Kennel Club shall be the final court of appeal or umpire in all questions of dispute of any kind whatsoever (except where such powers are delegated by the Kennel Club) arising out of the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

29. A person attending or entering a dog for the Show shall, by that act, be deemed to have agreed with the Committee, or delegated authority to refer any such questions or dispute to the Committee, or delegated authority.

30. Any owner, competitor, and other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling called by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licence show within the licensed venue within the environs of the event, including car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the setup period at this venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).

31. The owner, competitor, handler, or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times. Ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car, and caravan parks and approaches. **This Regulation** applies before (at any time during the setup period at the venue), during the event, and after words (at any time during the breakdown of the event).

32. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, weather an objection has been lodged or not, if proved, amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.

33. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

34. **CHILDREN AT THE SHOW.** Exhibitors will be held responsible for the behaviour of any Children in their charge at the show and will be accountable for any damage caused by such children at the Show.

- Publication of event results on our websites or any other related media or publication (Legitimate Interests)

We disclose data to our printer for the purpose of preparing show documentation

## Definition of Classes

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 15th June 2019. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes. A first prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value. If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options: -

**WITHDRAWAL** The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

**TRANSFER** a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight, or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy, Puppy and Junior excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight, or height. b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months of age, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class, or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight, or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height. c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight, or height.

If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class

**MINOR PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**PUPPY** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

**JUNIOR** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show

**YEARLING.** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of show

**NOVICE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB / CAC / Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not.)

**POST GRADUATE** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate /CACIB / CAC / Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT** For dogs which have not become Show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show

## Rules & Regulations

- Judging will start 30 minutes after Paignton and District Fanciers Association Show have awarded Best of Breed.
- Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed. By which time dogs must be removed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- Entry fees: First Entry per Dog - Members £15.00, Non-members £17.00  
Subsequent entries with same Dog - £2.00. (Members & Non-members)  
Not For Competition - £2.00 per Dog, Pre-paid Catalogues £3.00 each  
Membership - Single £4.00, Joint £5.00 per annum

- Prize money: There will be no prize money at this show.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- BEST PUPPY IN SHOW.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it should also automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show, respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Breed or Best Puppy in Show, respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best of Breed and Best in Show, respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.  
*Withdrawal from Competition.* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes or Best Puppy in Breed, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.  
*Proviso.* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be a beaten dog.
- BEST IN SHOW** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which had competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition  
*Withdrawal from Other Competition.* Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes and Best of Breed prior to the competition for Best of Group and Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best of Group or Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition. Dogs may be withdrawn from Any Variety Classes when judged before Breed Classes.  
*Proviso.* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be beaten dogs.
- Exhibits will not be admitted to the Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
- Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days Kennel Club Show Schedule Notice  
Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
