OUR JUDGE

Averil Cawthera-Purdy - Lireva

I have bred & shown Poms since I was a young girl. My parents bred & exhibited Samoyeds and I wanted a breed small enough so I could show them myself, Poms (living Teddy Bears every little girl's dream) were my choice and my passion for the breed is as strong now as ever.

Breeding and exhibiting, initially with my parents & now for decades with my husband Sean, I have always been the main handler and presenter of the Poms. I won my first CC at Crufts in 1977 with Cosmic Dancer of Lireva beating all the famous breeders and dogs of that truly Golden Age of Poms, including Mrs Gladys Dyke's famous Ch Hadleigh Honeypuff. My first Champion came a couple of years later, but it was with my 2nd homebred Champion that Lireva made history. Ch Lireva's Shooting Star is still classed as one of the UK's greatest Poms and was the UK's Top Toy Dog in '83 & topped his many high level wins by winning Reserve BIS at Crufts in '84, one of only 2 Poms ever to do this.

Over the intervening years Poms bred or exhibited by Lireva have won well over 350 CCs, 38 have been made up Champions, 16 of whom have had success at Toy Group level and 2 have won BISs at All Breed Championship Show level. 3 rank in the current top 5 CC winners for the breed.

I am passionate about Poms and have judged them world-wide, most recently, would you believe, the Pomeranian Club of New South Wales Australia! I judged the breed at Crufts back in '99 with an entry of 182, a very big entry even for those days and I still rank as one of the youngest judges at Crufts across all breeds.

I'm honoured to have been invited to judge by the Pom Club of South Wales, a Club I was a founder member of and have seen grow and develop over the years. I've always enjoyed their shows, learnt how to play Bingo, enjoyed a Welsh Cake or two and always, as we all have been, made to feel very welcome. I'm looking forward to judging your Poms and will do so to the very best of my ability, they all deserve no less. I thank you for your entries and wish you all a very happy and enjoyable day with the breed we all love.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at **9:00am.**
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time, but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at **10:00am**.
- 4. The show will close half an hour after judging has been completed by which time dogs must be removed.
 - Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry fees are: MEMBERS First Entry £11.00 per dog, subsequent entries with the same dog £3.00. NON-MEMBERS First Entry £15.00 per dog, subsequent entry with the same dog £4.00. Not for Competition £4.00 per dog. Catalogues £4.00 prepaid with entries only (none available on the day). Membership: Single £5.00, Joint £7.00, Lifelong Single £25.00, Lifelong Joint £35.00.
- 6. There is no Prize money on offer at this show.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under four calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

10. Best Puppy in Show

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show.

A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition

11. Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog</u> in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and

reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show regulation F11.

- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club authority to compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an authority to compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and The Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILILTY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Kennel Club rules and regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- 18. Not for competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered or.
- 19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of The Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
- 20. The Show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
- 21. The Committee of this Show cannot be held responsible for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show, and remind exhibitors that such products may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

- 22. Exhibitors/handlers are responsible for clearing up and removing any loose hair or fouling from dogs in their charge, or any other litter, whether from the car park, the exercise area or from any other part of the venue.
- 23. Parents/Guardians please note, well behaved children are welcome but those in charge of children will be held fully responsible for their actions and any damage caused within the environs of the Show.
- 24. Owners, handlers, exhibitors or any other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must ensure at all times that the dog is kept under proper Control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car parks and approaches.
- 25. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled Judge. This shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency.
- 26. Each exhibitor is responsible for providing their own crate or cage identification and should note that the original exhibit/bench number card, as provided by the show Society, must not be used for this purpose.
- 27. PHOTOGRAPHY & VIDEO RIGHTS The Organisers would like to bring the regulation of photography and filming to the attention of exhibitors, trade stands, press and visitors. It is a condition of all thoes attending the event that no filming or other form of recording may be taken or made at the venue without the express written permission of the organisers. The taking of photographs in the venue for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Organisers. Press accredited photographs are provided with permission to take photographs ONLY for use in newspapers, magazines and internet sites this is for news purposes only. There is no objection to the general public taking photographs or video film of general views of the show, provided that these are for private use only. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photography or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually takin place. However, judges may allow it to happened at the end of classes or after the Best in Show is awarded. Filming and flash photography is allowed from outside the rings at all times unless the operation of the camera is actually affecting exhibits. However, if a powerful flash unit is used or it is clear that exhibits are being affected, a ring steward or the Judge is empowered to stop the person concerned. Cinematograph or television Equipment may only be used at the show if a permit has been issued by the Organiser.
- 28. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 29. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Wins at championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **28**th **August 2025**

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.

(2) Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

BABY PUPPY A baby puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the

first day of the show.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day

of the Show...

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first

day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first

day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on

the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL BEGINNERS For owner, handler or exhibit not having won CC or RCC.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or

five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge

Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under The Kennel Club

Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 5 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge

Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at

the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries.

COMPETITION Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included

within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one

day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.




