### Rules & Regulations

- 1. The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m.
- The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed by which time dogs
  must be removed. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been
  completed.
- 5. **Entry Fees:** First Entry £5.50 per Dog; Subsequent Entry with the same dog £1.50 (not charity classes). Special/Charity Classes £3.00 per Dog per entry (class nos 41-43).

Not For Competition - £1.00 per dog; Catalogues - £2.00.

Membership: £2.50 Single / £3 Joint. *PLEASE NOTE:* If you are not already a Member, Membership Fees must be paid with your entry. Membership Fees paid with your entry will carry forward to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2026 and allow you to pay entry fees at member's rates for any show organized by the Society during 2026.

- 6. Prize Money for Charity Classes 1st £10; 2nd £5; 3rd £3; Res. £2; VHC £1
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

### 10. Best Puppy in Show.

Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. The selection of Best in Show may follow the selection of Best Puppy in Show and Best Veteran in Show (if scheduled) respectively. Where the Best of Breed, Best of Group or Best in Show is a puppy it

may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed, Reserve Best of Group or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Breed, Best Puppy in Group or Best Puppy in Show respectively.

- Best Puppy in Group and subsequent placings must be selected from those puppies which have been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy.
- 2) Best Puppy in Show must be selected from the Best Puppy in Group winners.

### 11. Best in Show

The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and has been declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

1) Best of Breed

Where a breed is separately classified a Best of Breed may be declared but only from those dogs which have received a first prize in a breed class at the show. Where separate classes are provided for each sex of a breed a Best of each Sex must be declared.

2) Best of Group

Best of group and subsequent group placings must be selected from:

- a) The Best of Breed winners in each group.
- b) The Best dog from the Any Variety Not Separately Classified classes in each group or on each day.
- c) The Best dog from the Any Variety Imported Breed Register classes in each group or on each day.
- 3) Best in Show

Best in Show must be selected from the Best of Group winners. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the remaining group winners following the selection for Best in Show. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.

- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the last announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- 14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

### 16. DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and The Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.

- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

## WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under The Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by The Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- 19. The Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to dogs or any other property or persons whether arising from accident or any other cause.
- 20. Bank Charges incurred as a result of incorrectly completed or dishonoured cheques will be passed on to the exhibitor and any exhibitor failing to pay entry fees and / or bank charges will be dealt with by the Kennel Club.
- 21. An exhibitor or competitor should ensure that contact details for any handler are available and must be provided upon request in any investigation of a breach of this regulation by such handler.

### **Definitions of Classes**

This Show is limited to Members of the Dorset County Canine Society. All dogs entered at this Limited Show must be in the ownership of members of the Dorset County Canine Society.

Dogs which have won a Challenge Certificate or obtained any award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognized by the Kennel Club are not eligible for entry at the show. Show awards issued by the Irish Kennel Club which count towards the title of Champion, shall be five point Green Stars or more. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **2nd November 2025**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

- (1) **Withdrawal**: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.
- (2) Transfer:
  - (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards it's breed, colour, sex, weight or height the

- Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of their being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show. **YEARLING:** For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate / CACIB / CAC / Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Open or Championship shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN:** For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show. **SPECIAL VETERAN (7-9 years):** For dogs of not less than seven years of age and not more than nine years of age on the day of the Show.

**SPECIAL VETERAN (10 years and over):** For dogs of not less than ten years of age on the day of the Show.

**SPECIAL YEARLING:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty four calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**BÉGINNERS:** For dog, handler & owner never to have won a First Prize at an Open Show or Championship Show.
